11th annual Rouge Rescue. Bar-rett said Enterprise is providing the parking and staging site, the city will provide heavy equip-ment and workers with chain

Although work gloves and garbage bags will be provided, anyone taking part should wear long sleeved shirts and pants, and work boots, Barrett said.

given T-shirts and other items.

"We take a snapshot of the Rouge River," said Mark Mitchell, one of the program coordinators.

The classes study their results and boil them down to a single

number, with 100 being the top.
Mitchell said this water quality
index typically varies from
around 88, in the headwaters
near Walled Lake, to 45 far
downstream.
