Hours for Family Day at the Detroit Institute of Arts are 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Museum admission is free, and includes a puppetmaking workshop, a treasure hunt, face painters, juggler Ken Krakat, caricature artist Richard Powell, Hobey Ford's Golden Rod Puppets, Cards for Kids, magic shows, sculptor Elaine Kears, glass artist Don Schneider, the MBS Dance Company and the Pointe Singers.

On Family Day, continuous shuttle service is offered between Historic Eastern Market and the DIA.

In the meantime, The Suicide Machines released two demos "Green World" and "The Essential" along with a 7". The band's big break came in 1995 when The Suicide Machines released a split CD "Skank for Brains" with San Francisco's Rudiments on Dill Records.

A song from the album, "New Girl" wobbled its way onto Detroit radio creating a buzz in the city. Hollywood Records sniffed around and swept up the

band.

"What drew me to them was the songs and the energy in which they played them. They fused punk and ska, instead of doing just punk or just ska, which I thought was interesting, fresh and cool," Hollywood's Raymond explained.

The Suicide Machines will hit the road once again the morning after their Friday, May 24, show at St. Andrew's Hall in Detroit. The quartet will tour

the west coast with Guttermouth and then join with the Specials in New Orleans in June. Also on the menu this summer are selected dates on the "Warped" tour which includes No FX, Pennywise, Mighty Mighty Bosstones and Bad Religion on some dates.

Raymond has high hopes for The Suicide Machines.
