

# Concert honors police officers

There will be no shortage of security at a Sunday evening concert at Grace Chapel in Farmington Hills.

Dr. Tom Clark of Alpha Psychological Services will perform on the largest digital pipe organ of its kind in the country. The music will range "from Bach to rock and back," said Clark.

But the audience will include police officers from several area departments including Farmington Hills, Birmingham, Canton, Garden City, Livonia, Plymouth and Plymouth Township, Southfield, West Bloomfield and Westland will attend the concert honoring police on Sunday, the last day of National Police Week.

ny Orchestra, The Detroit Brass Society, The Glasgow Rangers Pipe and Drum Band from Windsor along with several officers who will lend their musical talents to the program.

More than 50 law enforcement agencies and 150 officers are expected, including Michigan State Police and Detroit Police. Several police chiefs, including Farmington Hills Chief Bill Dwyer will attend.

Clark, who specializes in forensic and clinical psychiatry, is a consultant to several area police departments.

"Since I am a clinical and police psychologist as well as an organist, I wanted to honor and using some positive attention to our men and women in blue," he said. "If I am in trouble, I call a cop. But who does a cop call?"

"If law enforcement goes, everything goes," he said. "So we all need to care about our cops."

Clark called stress the "secret enemy of cops."

"Police are a foxhole brethren," he said.

The concert begins at 7 p.m. at Grace Chapel on 12 Mile and Halsted. Tickets are free, but required for the performance.




