ZONING AMENDATORY ORDINANCE
ORDINANCE NO. C-8-96**

An Ordinance to amend the City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, of the City of Farmington Hills, to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property as hereinafter mentioned.

The City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, hereby ordains:

Section 1. That the City Code of the City of Farmington Hills, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, is hereby amended in part to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property in the City as follows: to show B-3, General Business District classification where LI-1, Light Industrial District classification is now shown in the area described as follows:

Sidwell #23-19-451-011, 012, 013
A part of the East 1/2 of Section 19, T1N, R9E, City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, commonly known as 24465 Hathaway, 24435 Hathaway and 38180-38220 Grand River Avenue.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 3. The provision of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect twenty-one days after their enactment.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Council Members of the City of Farmington Hills, at a duly called meeting held on the 14th day of May, 1996, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law.
