Lake Western's Ryan Vicary and Ryan Klossky ousted North's Aaron Scheinfeld and Jeremy Lewis, 1-6, 6-2, 6-3.

Plymouth Salem tied for third place with Farmington thanks to the efforts of its top two singles players Kinning Li and Gabe Borman.

Li repeated as WLAA champion at No. 1, raising his record to 26-1 (entering the regional) with a 6-4, 6-3 triumph over Livonia Churchill Matt Eszes, the No. 2 seed.

In the semifinals, Li dispatched Chad Crosby of Livonia Stevenson in straight sets, while Eszes ousted North's Seth Weingarten.

"He (Eszes) has gotten better since last year," Li said. "I beat

him 6-0, 6-1 last year, but his serve is bigger. He's a quality player."

Li, a senior, also has improved on his game from a year ago. His only loss of the spring came against Class B state champ Ryan Tomlinson of Three Rivers in a tiebreaker in a tournament held in Bay City.

"I've tried to work on movement and strength," said Li, who is entertaining NCAA Division I scholarship offers from Eastern Michigan, Campbell (N.C.) and Missouri-Kansas City. "My serve-and-volley game is getting better and my forehand is stronger."

Li is ranked No. 58 in the Western Tennis Association (Boys 18s) and third in SEMTA.

Falcons gain split with Rocks

Wes Cornwell pitched a three-hitter in the second game of a baseball doubleheader Friday to lead Farmington High to a 5-4 victory and a split with Plymouth Salem.

The Rocks, who were the home team in the first game at Farmington, won the opener 6-1 behind the three-hit pitching of Ryan Andrzejewski.

Cornwell had seven strikeouts, walked two and overcame five errors by his teammates in the field.

The Falcons scored the winning run in the bottom of the seventh inning when Jake Siskosky's bases-loaded single sent pinch-runner Charlie Jaeger to the plate.

Farmington touched Salem pitcher Keith Boughner for 11 hits, including three by Brian Murray, who had a double and scored a run.

Tom Mondoux hit a solo homer and Nick Latra a two-run triple.

Chuck Archambeau added an RBI single.

Boughner also walked six. All of the Salem runs were unearned.

In the opener, Andrzejewski struck out four and walked one.

Nick Latra (6-2), who left after three innings because of a sore arm, suffered his second straight loss, giving up six hits, no walks and three runs.

The Rocks took a 4-0 after four innings. Ryan Rumberger hit a three-run homer in the third following an error that would have ended the inning.

Paul Mitchell doubled and scored the Farmington run on Archambeau's single to make it 4-1.

The Falcons finish 5-5 in the Lakes Division and 11-5 in the Western Lakes Activities Association. Farmington is 12-8 over-

all. Dan McLaughlin and Archambeau hit three-run homers Wednesday as the Falcons defeated Farmington Harrison 10-4.

McLaughlin was 3-for-3, including a single, double and sacrifice, with four RBIs. Mitchell went 3-for-4 and scored two runs, and Archambeau also had four RBIs and two hits -- the other being a double.

Jaeger (4-1) pitched a complete game, notching four strikeouts and walking four.

Harrison scored all its runs on Kevin Horton's grand slam that tied the score 4-4 in the second inning. Chris Puzzuoli had two hits.

Derocier started on the mound, allowing four runs in the first inning, but the loss went to reliever Matt Sullivan.

HARRISON 7, CANTON 8: The host Chiefs scored the winning run in the bottom of the eighth inning Friday to defeat

Farmington Harrison. Jason Bricker scored the winning run on a two-out single by John Wright. Both players had two hits.

Chris Chatham hit a three-run double for the Hawks, who went 0-for-3 last week and slipped to 12-7 overall.

Harrison is 4-4 in the Western Division with a makeup doubleheader to be played today at Livonia Franklin.

Matt Derocier was the third of three Harrison pitchers, pitched one inning and was tagged with the loss.

Marc Hazard pitched the last two innings to get the win.
