Currently, some cases are handled by circuit courts, others by probate court. Under the VanRegemmorter substitute. Family Court would be a division of circuit court. He said this proposal would also provide more equitable state funding of courts.
HB 6168, drafted by House Judiciary chair Michael Nye, Richield, and the state funding of courts. Lethefield, provides for perading the duties of courts between the three levels of trial courts_circuit, probate and district, bluring the distinctions between them. A companion measure would abielish the constitutional requirement that every county maintain a probate court.

Bottom line in both proposals: Spread judicial resources more evenly, have more flexibility in assigning judges, and reduce the need for more judgeships.
