# Cities reconfigure formula for jointly-funded agencies

The cities of Farmington and Farmington Hills agreed to change the formula they use to pay for the library system, court and other jointly funded agencies.

At their recent joint meeting, the two city councils discussed the budgets. Those agencies will now receive a larger share from Farmington.

now receive a larger share from Farmington.

"This is much fairer for the two communities," said Farming-ton City Manager Frank Lauhoff. "This will make the funding more stable."

funding more stable."
Under the new formula, Farmington will pay 10.64 percent of the money for the jointly funded agencies compared to 9.30 per-

cent under the old formula.

Hills Finance Director Charles osch said the old formula had used taxable value of property as a basis for most joint funding. The new formula also figures in Farmington's population.

rarmington's population.

Both cities will be aided in
their budget process because
they use a formula, based on the
known quantities of taxable
value and population, with
which to budget.

which to budget.
Lauhoff said that the city had
benefited from many of Farmington Hills' programs, such as
senior services. The new formula
increased Farmington's share by
\$40,882 from \$107,618 in
1995/96 to \$148,500 for fiscal
1996/97 for the senior
program/activities center, recre-

The new formula does not apply to the library, where Farmington will pay 9.30 percent, and the 47th District Court, where Farmington will chip in 14.48 percent of the cost.

The cities will contribute \$15,350 to the Farmington Area Arts Commission, \$51,790 to Farmington Youth Assistance, \$1,050 to the Commission on Aging, \$133,025 to the Farmington Area Counseling Centers, \$2,507,369 to the Farmington Community Library and \$1,916,543 to the court.
