

# Miss America celebrates '96 Nurses Week

Kaye Lani Rae Rafko, R.N., the Monroe native who reigned as Miss America in 1988, spoke to an enthusiastic gathering of Botsford General Hospital's nursing staff recently as part of the Farmington Hills hospital's recognition of 1996 Nurses Week.

Rafko spoke to more than 100 staff nurses at Botsford about visioning and professionalism in nursing during the special presentation. Rafko, the only registered nurse to be crowned Miss America, spoke of the rich tradition of bedside nursing and how it remains, even as the nation approaches the millennium, an integral part of patient health. She also emphasized the evolving role of professional nurses

and their impact on the health care system.

"Ms. Rafko was wonderful and her talk was so invigorating," said Mollie Evans, administrator of Nursing Services at Botsford. "She really made us proud to be nurses."

During her year long reign, Rafko brought national attention not only to the important role nurses play in American health care, but to the nation's critical health care issues — AIDS, cancer, hospice care and the structural changes that health care facilities face.

Currently pursuing a master's degree at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, Rafko is a 1985 graduate of the St. Vincent Medical Center School of
