

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS

Farmington Hills firefighters made 86 runs for the week of May 27 to June 2 including 49 medical emergencies (57 percent), nine rescues and three fires.

FIRES

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 2 put out a small fire in the storage/garbage area behind the Farmington Souvlaki restaurant on Orchard Lake at 7:33 p.m. June 1. Arson is suspected in the fire that caused \$5,000 in property damage and \$50 in damage to contents. Although the building, and the adjoining Borders Books and Music are sprinkled, water and smoke damage could have been much worse, firefighters said. Another set fire causing \$11,000 in damage at the Lone Star Steak House on Orchard Lake in May. Anyone who saw anything unusual at the time of the Souvlaki fire should call the fire department at 553-0740.

A resident of the Green Hill Apartments on Green Hill fell asleep while some chicken was cooking at 3:53 a.m. June 3. The water boiled out of the pan, causing it to char and smoke. The alarm was activated and firefighters from Station 1 responded. There was no fire. Damage to contents was \$25.

DRUNKEN DRIVING

In Farmington Hills: Hills police arrested a Hills woman, 46, for driv-

ing a 1996 Ford Taurus east on 12 Mile at Middlebelt at 1:15 a.m. June 1 while drunk. The car crossed the center line twice and ran a red light. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .22 percent. A level of .1 percent is considered too drunk to drive in Michigan.
