

Tournament officials have a plan to help relieve the shuttle service flow during rush hour.

"On Thursday and Friday we hope to keep some of the better golfers out on the course a little later to keep the spectators there a little longer," said Warthy

"We hope people will cooperate. If we can get the cooperation of the people from around this area to use that remote site it will really help," he said. "It will work smoothly if people give the Silverdome a reasonable shot."
