

# Canton girls win state title Blue Devils edge Shamrocks

Cinderella's dead.  
To be truthful, that misnomer ended when both Plymouth Canton and Troy reached Saturday's Class A final girls soccer. Each team had to wear that tug throughout the state tournament, as if getting to the final, which was hosted by Canton, was a matter of luck.  
It wasn't. Still, as Troy coach Kevin Kelly noted, "I'd rather be lucky any day."  
On Saturday, his Colts weren't. Two well-matched teams battled for 80 minutes, but it was Canton that cashed in the big plays to emerge with a 2-0 triumph.  
The victory gave the Chiefs their second state girls soccer championship - the first came in 1988 - and the school's second state title in soccer in as many years. The Canton boys were champs in '95.  
"We've been playing one good game, one bad game, going back and forth," said Canton coach Don Smith. "I think the girls were ready to come out and have a good one today."

Grosse Pointe South baseball coach Dan Griesbaum says his team has lost "five or six games" this season in the last inning.

The Blue Devils managed to hang on when it mattered most Saturday, defeating Redford Catholic Central, 3-2, in the Class A regional final at Southgate number 9.

Senior right-hander Kevin Schroeder, bound for the University of Toledo on a baseball scholarship, threw a four-hitter with five strikeouts and five walks against a potent CC lineup.

It was Griesbaum's second regional championship in 13 years as South's coach, his first since 1987.

Schroeder received fine defensive support, especially by center fielder Terry Brennan, who retreated to the fence to make catches on long flies by Kevin Thomas and Garret Burch.

Schroeder pitched CC cleanup batter Mike Daguanno carefully walking him twice and getting him to fly out in his other plate appearance.

"This is unbelievable," said Schroeder, who set the Shamrocks down in order in both the sixth and seventh innings. "Our main goal from the beginning of the season was to go to the Final Four and now we're one step away. That's a great team. They hit the hell out of the ball all game. I fell behind early on the count and had to throw the fastball."

CC, 23-11, advanced to the final with a 10-4 semifinal victory over Taylor Kennedy, which


