

## POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

### FIRES

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 2 responded to a report of light smoke in the Old Orchard Theater on Orchard Lake at 10:34 p.m. June 4. Firefighters found that air conditioning equipment on the roof had arced and shut off the main power. The manager cleared the theater, but there was no fire and no injuries. The manager called the engineer to the scene. There was no damage estimate at the time.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 answered the call for a fire caused by the collision

of a 1988 Mazda 626 and a school bus on M-5 at Grand River at 3:28 p.m. June 5. The car hit the bus in the rear, causing an engine fire that was put out with extinguishers. There were no injuries. Damage was estimated at \$3,500.

### THEFT

## Murder trial date set

Two men accused of killing two Farmington Hills women and setting their house on fire in December of 1995 will stand trial for murder July 2 in Oakland Circuit Court.

Judge Barry Howard will hear the case. Arthur Hollingsworth Cayce and George Tyrone Davis of Westland, will face first degree murder, felony murder

and arson charges in the death of Helen Louise Bovair, 52, and her daughter Melissa, 21.

Cayce is also charged in a separate case of abducting, beating, raping and threatening to kill his former girlfriend 11 days after the arson.

Both men are being held in the Oakland County Jail without bond.
