

POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

**FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS**  
Farmington Hills firefighters made 130 runs for the week of June 3-9 including 62 medical emergencies (48 percent), 14 rescues and five fires.

**FIRES**  
Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 2 put out an engine fire in a 1989 Ford Taurus at 5:33 p.m. June 7 on the shoulder of westbound I-696 west of Farmington. Damage was estimated at \$3,000.

Hills firefighters from Station 1 responded to a fire at an apartment at the Fairmont Park Apartments on Glen Court at 11:31 p.m. The resident came out to the kitchen and saw a pan of grease burning. She turned off the flame and turned on the vent when the grease ignited. She then took another pan and put it on top of the first pan, carried it to the door wall but dropped it before she could throw it out the door. The carpet caught fire and the woman then threw out the

burning grease. The fire was out when firefighters arrived. The woman was taken to Botsford General Hospital with first and second degree burns on her right foot and right hand. The fire caused \$1,500 in damage to the apartment and \$500 in damage to contents.

**AUTO THEFT**  
*In Farmington Hills:*  
A gold 1995 Toyota Camry worth \$22,000 was stolen from the Fairmont Park Apartments on Maywood June 10-11.

**VANDALISM**  
*In Farmington Hills:*  
Yard lights were pulled up from a lawn causing \$250 in damage at a residence on Old Homestead June 10-11. The driver's side window was broken (\$300) on a 1988 Ford Mustang parked on Averhill June 13.

The men were arrested at 2 a.m. after a traffic stop of a gray 1991 Ford on Clubhouse Lane. A stolen briefcase, cellular phone and other items were discovered.

Someone entered an apartment at the Grand Court apartments on Grand river and stole \$1,000 from a purse June 1. The air bags (\$300) were stolen from a green 1995 Saturn parked at the Green Hill Apartments on Green Hills June 12 after the rear driver's side vent window had been broken (\$75).

Man to face trial

A California man will face trial in Oakland County Circuit Court on charges of driving drunk resulting in a fatality.

James Arthur Hein, 41, of Del Mar, Calif. was bound over from 47th District Court in Farmington Wednesday on the 16-year felony. Hein has been living with his parents in Commerce Township for the past three months.

He remains free on \$10,000 personal bond.

The charges stem from a fatal accident in which Elenya Rainbow, of Denver, Colo. was struck and killed by a car at 10:16 p.m. May 6 while riding her mountain bike west on Freedom Road near Drake.

Police came to the scene and found Hein in his 1985 Mercury Marquis, which was facing east on the south side of the road. Police obtained a blood sample from the driver that showed a blood alcohol level of .12 percent. A level of .1 percent is considered too drunk to drive in Michigan.

Rainbow, 45, had been visiting her parents who live near the accident scene and had been riding her bike back to the Red Roof Inn on Sincoia, where she was staying. She was a bicycling enthusiast.

In testimony Wednesday before Judge Fred Harris, the victim's mother testified that the bike's rear strobe reflector was working. Officers confirmed that it was working when they found the victim and her bike.

The woman was pronounced dead at the scene.
