Man to face trial

A California man will face trial in Oakland County Cir-cuit Court on charges of driv-ing drunk resulting in a fatal-ity.

James Arthur Hein, 41, of Del Mar, Calif. was bound over from 47th District Court in Farmington Wednesday on the 15-year felony. Hein has been living with his parents in Commerce Township for the past three months.

He remains free on \$10,000 personal bond.

The charges stem from a fatal accident in which Elenya Rainbow, of Denver, Colo. was struck and killed by a car at 10:15 p.m. May 6 while riding her mountain bike west on Freedom Road near Drake.

Police came to the scene and found Hein in his 1985 Mercury Marquis, which was facing east on the south side of the road. Police obtained a blood sample from the driver that showed a blood alcohol level of .12 percent. A level of .12 percent is considered too drunk to drive in Michigan.

Rainbow, 45, had been visit-ing her parents who live near the accident scene and had been riding her bike back to the Red Roof Inn on Sinaco-la, where she was staying. She was a bicycling enthusi-ast

In testimony Wednesday before Judge Fred Harris, the victim's mother testified that the bike's rear strobe reflector was working, Officers con-firmed that it was working when they found the victim and her bike.

The woman was pro-nounced dead at the scene.
