"Half of the things (Matthews) does in the first part (of recording) he's not really singing lyrics. He's just singing phrases that fit well with the melody that he hears in his head. From his phrasing, words start to appear. Steve would take all those bits and pieces that weren't really words and help Dave pick his brain."

"What we do from there is we grab from the different areas of music – this part would sound good with this part. As a group that's when we really start to fine-tune the song. When Dave plays guitar, it's like he's making a sculpture from there."

The Dave Matthews Band formed in 1991 with Matthews, snxophonist LcRoi Moore, Lessard, and drummer Carter Beauford with violinist Boyd Tinsley jumping on board later that year. Lessard said his parents were pretty relaxed about his teenage obsession.
