## Longtime school board trustee closes out 20 years of meetings

In her last official act on the Farmington School Board Tuesday, Helen Prutow seconded a motion to accept the consent agenda.

Coincidentally, the agenda included approval of 31 employee retirements — some of whom had just been hired when Prutow was first elected in 1976. Prutow is stepping down after 20 years on the Farmington board.

Trustee R. Jack Inch becomes the most senior board member with 18 years.

Prutow will remain active in the Michigan Association of School Boards — where she is past president — and on the Oakland Intermediate District Board.

"I'm not done yet," Prutow said.

Princilla Brouillette was elected to fill Prutow's seat in the June 10 election. Prutow officially handed Brouillette with the bulging district policy manual, and wished the soon-to-be sworn in trustee luck.

Prutow also presented fellow board members with gifts, including coffee mugs with the inscription: "A-plus leaders build achievers."

Before coffee cups were passed out, though, trustees poured praise on their colleague.

Trustee Cathy Webb lauded Prutow for giving her life to education. She has been a leader and a model for board members, Trustee Joe Svoke added.

"We'll miss that laugh," Trustee Bobbie Feldman said.

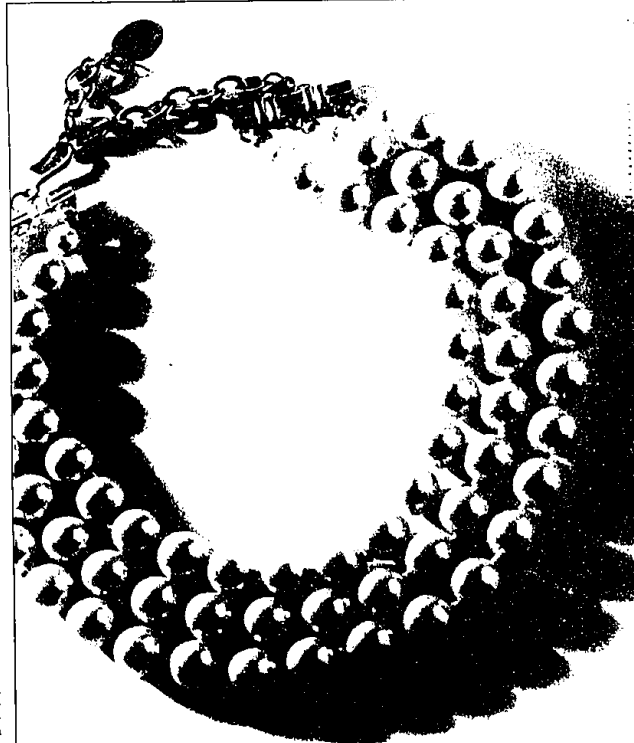
