Farmington adult education would be hurt dramatically, according to Terry Klenezar, director of Farmington Adult and Community Education. Programs that are offered are high school completion, job training classes, OED preparation, English language for adult immigrants, and basic literacy for adults.

Adult education services approximately 400 to 500 students per year. Many students carn a high school diploma which requires more goal acting than a GED. 
