Standoff averted; Man found dead BY WILLIAM COUTANT

An attempt by Farmington Hills police to prevent a man from hurting himself or oth-ers ended Monday afternoon when officers discovered his body in a Ravine Court apart-ment.

The man, 40, had told his former girl-friend, 39, that he wanted to come to her apartment at the Mulrwood Apartments, Grand River and Drake to get his clothes after she told him their relationship had

The woman told police that he used his own key to enter the apartment at 4 p.m. Sunday and had a pistol that he pointed at her several times during the next 16 hours.

The woman said she had dated the man for 1 1/2 years and had tried to break off

their relationship several times, unsuccessfully. The man had been convicted of stealing her car in February of 1995 and was on probation. They had reconciled in December, but continued to have problems resulting in the man physically assaulting the woman on July 6 at her apartment.

The woman fled her apartment at that time and Farmington Police arrested the

On Sunday, the man yolled at the woman and hit her several times. Through the night, the woman was able to convince him not to kill her, as he had threatened.

At 7 a.m. Monday, she left the apartment
and went to the Farmington Hills Folice Station on 11 Mile to report the incident.
About 10 officers responded to the apartment to make sure the situation did not
develop into a barricade situation, police

"It had the potential to become a barricade situation," said Lt. Chuck Nebus. "Fortu-nately, no shots were fired at police or other residents."

Hills Sgt. Craig Summers made contact by phono with the man early in the morning in an effort to get him to come out peacefully and police brought the man's mother from Detroit to talk with him.

But at 10:45 a.m., police lost contact with the man. The entered the apartment at 3 p.m. and discovered the body. The man was pronounced dead from a gun shot wound to the head.

"We did not treat it as a barricaded gun-man situation," said Hills police Chief Bill Dwyer. "According to his mother, he was very depressed."
