
'Firebird' in Hills



Fowl flie: Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 3 put out at house fire on Power south of Folsum at 4:19 p.m. July 17. Investigators found that the fire started in the power panel at the rear of the house after power had gone off and then come on again. Workers from Detroit Edison later found a bird that had been burned by secondary power wires and told firefighters that the bird caused the short circuit. The residents were on vacation at the time. Damage to the house is estimated at \$50,000 and damage to contents is \$8,000.


