He missed the fishing in Michigan

Bass, bass and more bass. That's what I missed here in Michigan last week while taking in some of the Centennial Olympic action in "Hotlanta," Georgia. With temperatures hovering in the upper 90s and a heat index of 105 degrees, the climate in Atlanta was as hot as the competition. But judging from the mail and messages I received last week while I was gone, it seems bass were producing the hottest action around here.

Red Man results

David Reault and Ed Dietrich of Livonia and Chuck Economou of Lake Orion all placed in the top 10 of the recent Red Man Michigan Division qualifier on

Lake Muskegon. Reault had the best finish of the trio, placing fifth in the 131-angler field. Fishing grubs, spoons and spinner bait in the main lake Reault landed four bass which tipped the scale at 10 pounds, 12 ounces. He received \$394 for his efforts.

Economou earned \$308 for a seventh-place finish with five bass, which weighed 10 pounds, 1 ounce. Dietrich finished ninth with four bass, which weighed 8 pounds, 4 ounces. He earned \$200.

On top of the cash stipends, Reault, Economou and Dietrich also earned valuable points in the race to qualify for the Red Man Regional. At the conclusion of six Michigan Division qualifiers the top 30 anglers, based on a combination of pounds of fish caught and points accumulated, advance to the regional tournament. At the regional they will compete against the top 30 anglers from three other divi-

sions for a spot in the prestigious Red Man All-American where the winner will receive \$100,000. For information on upcoming Red Man events call (602) 362-8110.

Tri-State results

Kevin Lamb of Bloomfield Hills and Scott Dobson of Port Austin teamed up to place fifth in a Tri-State Tournament Trail bass tournament July 20 on Lake St. Clair. They earned \$600 for their finish.

Despite high winds and rough waters, Lamb and Dobson out-fished 134 of the 139 teams competing. Their seven-fish creel tipped the scale at 14.23 pounds.
