Kids rewarded for wearing helmets

Farmington Hills police are hoping that a new incentive program will get kids to wear helmats while bicycling.

"This is a good way to help prevent head injuries," said Hills police Chief Bill Dwyer.

At the same time, it gives police a chance to make a positive contact and improve community policing.

The helmet safety incentive program, which went into affect with 24 allows police.

make a positive contact and improve community policing.

The helimet safety incentive program, which went into effect July 24, allows police to issue coupons to young teens and children caught swearing helmets. The coupons are redeemable for food and treats at some local merchants.

The program is an alternative to an earlier proposal by the city's Commission on Children, Youth and Families that would have created a city ordinance fining children 16 or under who were caught riding a bicycle without a helmet.

The Farmington Hills City Council wedown the idea, 6-2, with Council Membeers Jon Grant and Nancy Bates approving. Com-

mission Chairman Richard Daguanno had cited national statistics on the numbers and seriousness of preventable head injuries due to bicyclists not wearing helmets. He also provided information about cities that had adopted an ordinance. But the council saw the ordinance as one that would criminalize children and their parents and give police another law to enforce.

"A seven or nine-year-old won't forget that kind of negative contact with a police officer," Dwyer said. "This is a 180-degree turnaround from that approach. It will reward safe behavior."

The program will promote wearing helmets while biking. Rollerbladding or skate boarding and reduce injuries. Dwyer said.

Uniformed officers who contact children "being safe" will issue the coupons redeemable for items such as cones, kids meals and other items. Farmington Hills officers plan to disperse about 1,000 coupons during the remainder of the summer. "We think it's a good way to promote safety, so we decided to join after a meeting with our corporation," said Chris Ptaszek, owner of Mr. Pita in Farmington Hills.
