# Police nab 3 in bank robbery

Police officers from four communities joined forces to arrest three men for attempted armed robbery at the Comerica Bank branch on Grand River at Middlebelt Monday.

Arraigned before Judge Maria Parker in Farmington's 47th District Court Tuesday afternoon on assault and robbery charges were Detroiters Norman Andrew Williams, 28, and Aaron Paul Jones, 22, and Andre Hurston, a 22-year-old Southfield resident.

The three, who stood mute at the arraignment, were charged with assault with intent to rob while armed. In addition, Williams was charged with possession of a firearm and carrying a concealed weapon.

Bond was set at \$75,000 each for Williams and Hurston, and at \$25,000 for Jacobs. Preliminary exams for the suspects are scheduled for Friday, Aug. 16, in 47th District Court.

A Southfield woman, 43, told Farmington Hills police that she was depositing \$14,000 in cash and check receipts from a gas station at the bank at 11:45 a.m.

As she approached the bank, a man jumped down from a cement wall between the bank and the Deli Man restaurant, approached her and demanded the blue vinyl deposit bag she was carrying.

She refused to give him the bag, turned to run and fell onto the ground. The man then pointed a 9 mm, chrome-plated pistol and again demanded the gun. She again refused as customers and bank employees came out of the building to help her.

A witness driving by saw the incident and saw the man flee from the east entrance, where the woman had fallen, to Grand River.

He got into a red Honda Civic with two other men at the Deli Man parking lot.

Redford police saw the suspect car as it entered the township and Southfield police followed the car to a dead end street.

The suspects fled the car in a wooded area northeast of Nine Mile and Inkster. Redford police caught one of the suspects and Farmington Hills officers caught another.

Farmington Hills plain clothes officers tackled the third man, who they believe used the gun, in a subdivision north of Sans Souci and east of Middlebelt. Another gun was found in the car.

Officers from Farmington Hills, Redford, Southfield and Livonia responded and helped capture the three suspects.

Farmington Hills police Lt. Chuck Nebus and police believe the suspects were also involved in a July 24 in which a victim was robbed in a similar fashion while taking a deposit bag to the same bank. The getaway car in that incident was described as a small red compact and the description of the robber matched that of the one of the men involved in Monday's robbery.

Redford police also report a similar robbery at a Comerica Bank at Plymouth and Fenton in which the description of the suspects and method were similar.
