# 2 arrested in robbery

Two Detroit men were arrested in connection with an armed robbery of a Total gas station on Halsted and 12 Mile early Thursday morning.

Robbers made off with \$100 cash and two cartons of cigarettes after brandishing what appeared to be a gun concealed by a sweatshirt. The pair sped off in a light colored vehicle. No one was hurt.

Farmington police officer Terry Purves noticed a car matching the description of the suspect vehicle traveling on eastbound Grand River near Smithfield. He pulled over the 1987 Dodge Daytona and ordered the driver out.

Crumpled dollar bills and Kool cigarettes were found in the vehicle along with a sawed-off tail pipe covered by a white sweatshirt.

Both men, ages 42 and 36, were scheduled to be arraigned Friday.

Around 4:45 a.m., a gas station employee said a man came in and asked for change. He returned with another man when they announced the hold-up.

# Driver injured as auto crashes into sheriff's car

A Dearborn Heights man remains in stable condition at Botsford General Hospital after an accident Wednesday at 2:55 a.m. on southbound I-275 at Grand River.

Steven Jaquish, 33, was injured when his car struck an Oakland County Sheriff's Department cruiser from behind while the car was pulled over on a traffic stop.

Deputy Rick Cigile, 38, had pulled over a motorcycle driven by Tyree A. Jones, 30, of Detroit. Jones was seated in the rear of the cruiser and Cigile was seated in the front seat at the time.

All three men were taken to Botsford. Cigile and Jones were treated and released.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 responded to the accident and with Community EMS.
