

POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

DRUNKEN DRIVING

In Farmington Hills:
A Wixom man, 48, was arrested for driving his gray 1988 Ford Thunderbird while drunk at Grand River and Pearl, 9 p.m. Sept. 5. A preliminary blood test showed his blood alcohol level to be .26 percent. A level of .1 percent is considered too drunk to drive in Michigan.

A Hills man, 24, was arrested for driving drunk in his black 1992 Dodge Dakota after he hit a garage at St. Francis and Sedalia at 9:30 p.m. Sept. 5. A preliminary blood test showed his blood alcohol level to be .14 percent.

A Milford man in a black 1988 Pontiac Grand Prix caused a minor accident before being arrested for drunken driving at 10 Mile and Haggerty about 11:50 p.m. Sept. 5. His preliminary blood test showed a blood alcohol level of .2 percent.

An Eastpointe man, 60, was arrested for driving a red 1985 Ford Escort while drunk at 9 Mile and Inkster about 12:30 a.m. Sept.

6. He refused a preliminary blood test.

THEFT

In Farmington Hills:
Four money orders for \$500 each were used to embezzle \$2,000 from the Mobil station at Orchard Lake and 13 Mile on Aug. 7. The shortage was recently discovered. The suspect, a Detroit man who works there, is being investigated for a similar incident that took place later that month at the same location.

A bicycle worth \$225 was taken from the unlocked garage of a vacationing Hills family between Aug. 23 and Sept. 2.

A scuba tank, skis, a computer and printer worth a total of \$3,600 were stolen from a Hills woman at Country Ridge Apartments on Crestforest between Aug. 29 and Sept. 3.

In Farmington Hills:

Manor on Eight Mile, around 8:40 p.m. Sept. 3. The attackers are believed to be friends of the car's occupants.

VANDALISM

In Farmington Hills:
Five windows on the north side of The Marketplace Solution, on Indoplex Circle, were shot with a BB gun between Aug. 30 and Sept. 3.

THREAT

In Farmington Hills:
An Ecorse, man angry at his insurance policy being denied, made threats to employees at American Insurance on Halsted. On Sept. 5, he threatened to bring a gun into the office. He has four warrants for his arrest on misdemeanor charges.
