CITY COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING MEETING
SEPTEMBER 16, 1996

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Vagnozzi at 7:30 p.m.

Council Present: Barnett, Bates, Ellis, Grant, Oliverio, Sever, and Vagnozzi.

COUNCIL TOOK THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS:

- Received report on city's after-school Youth Program.
- Denied request to rezone property located on the northeast corner of Haggerty and Nine Mile Roads to Commercial Business.
- Determined NOT to proceed with dry floor activities at ice arena for summer of 1997; directed staff to study issue further for dry floor activities for summer of 1998.
- Directed City Administration to proceed with grant request for environmental study and possible reclamation action for Grand Haggerty Salvage Yard, Haggerty and Grand River.
- Requested Planning Commission to review political signs issue.
- Authorized submission of letter to Oakland County Public Transit Authority re: collection/distribution of SMART millage funds; Agreed to host meeting of officials from opt-in communities to address issue.
