

POLICE & FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS

Farmington Hills firefighters made 108 runs for the week of Sept. 9-15. There were 69 medical emergencies (65 percent), 16 rescues and five fires.

FIRES

In Farmington Hills: Hills firefighters from Stations 2 and 3 put out a fire in a kitchen of a house on Astor at 5:43 p.m. Sept. 13. Firefighters found smoke coming from an electrical outlet. Damage to the property was \$15,000 and damage to the contents was \$3,000.

Firefighters from Station 3 put out a fire in a bedroom closet at a residence at the Streamwood condos on Middlebelt at 7:04 a.m. Sept. 16. A resident said he had turned up the thermostat on his heating unit before hearing a loud popping noise from the furnace room. He attempted to put out the fire with a dry chemical

extinguisher and then called the fire department. Damage to the apartment building was \$30,000. Damage to contents was \$20,000.

STALKING

In Farmington Hills: Hills police arrested a Southfield man, 67, at 6 a.m. Sept. 13 in Section 20 after he had called and threatened a Hills woman, 39, with death over money he said he gave her. When police arrived at the woman's house, the man was there and appeared intoxicated. He shoved police officers trying to question him and was arrested.

A Hills woman, 25, told police that a Novi man, 36, has been harassing her and threatening her since she broke up with him a month ago. The man left a message on her voice mail threatening to break her legs Sept. 13.

VANDALISM

In Farmington: The front door of the Nine Grand Party Store at Grand

River and Nine Mile was broken sometime during the early morning hours of Sept. 15. The damage was estimated at \$160.

In Farmington Hills:
