Potentilla (several colors of bloom). Lilaes, Syringa, Viburnum, Viburnum species and Weigela species are avail-able in several varieties.

Azaleas and Rhododendrons, Rhododendron species, shouldn't be overlooked as these broadleaf evergreens add a handsome note to many gardens. Many roses, Rosa species, are hardy and carefree and may be worth a try.

A new book, "Hardy Trees and Shrubs: A Guide to Disease-resistant Varieties for the North," Robert Osborne, photographs, Beth Powning (Key Porter Books, \$19.95, soft), con-tains all of this information and more. Many of the plants described in detail in the book are hardy from zones 2 to 5. The author gives beautiful descriptions as well as practical advice.

There are chapters about general care, pruning and nurturing, pests and diseases. The appendix gives all perti-nent information at a glance, broken down by species, Latin and common name, hardiness zone and average mature height.
