Local clinics offer drive-in immunization

For the fifth consecution, year, the Royal Oak Medical Center will offer its drive-in flu immunization program in which people can obtain a flu shot without ever leaving their car.

Drive-in flu shots will be offered at locations in Royal Oak and Farmington Hills, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Sat-

urday.

Dr. M. George, director of

said he first launched the
drive-in flu shot program in
