With the Nov. 5 election about its respective weeks away, the two candidates for Oakland County prosecutor seem to be focusing on the differences between them.

At a candidate forum last week at Congregation Shaarey Zedek in Southfield, for example, Republican David Goreyca and Democrat Steven Kaplan were careful as each outlined what would be his policy on ples bargaining.

Plea bargaining is the practice that offers to drop or reduce a charge in exchange for a defendant's guilty plea to a lesser offense. A defendant might be induced to plead guilty, for

example, to second degree murder—even if it meant going to prison for 10 years—if the prosecutor were to dismiss charges of first degree murder—a charge the usually carries a mandatory sentence of life in prison.
