North was penalized four times for holding, one of which resulted in a touchdown being called back.

"We had more of everything except points," North coach Jim O'Leary said. "When a team flat out beats you and there's no opportunities there, you can live with that."

"We shut them down pretty well; we just didn't capitalize on our chances. But good teams take advantage of their breaks, and teams that are struggling never seem to."

Late in the first half, Farmington drove to the North 26 with the help of two 15-yard, face-mask penalties before running out of steam.

The Raiders turned around and marched to the Farmington 13 in just four plays, a penalty for pass interference providing a boost.

But Brant Reilly's touchdown pass to Carter Campbell with 23 seconds left in the half was nullified by a holding call. The Raiders got 1 yard on a reverse, and the half ended with two incomplete passes.

After an exchange of fumbles early in the third quarter, North gained possession at the Farmington 36, but a holding penalty on second down put the Raiders in a hole again.

"Every time we got in a situation where we could score we stopped ourselves, and that's what has happened all year," O'Leary said.

"I thought up to two minutes left, when we made the last turnover, we would win the game. We stopped ourselves; they really hadn't stopped us."

Niskanen said he and his coaches thought it was time to call the pass play to Viano in the fourth quarter, but he refused to take credit for it.

North's last two possessions ended with an interception and a fumble. On fourth-and-1 at midfield, the Falcons drew the Raiders offside and were able to run out the clock.

Lewis completed six of 12 passes for 109 yards. Viano caught two for 80 yards, Bryant Bronner three for 28. Junior tailback Jon Zomphier carried the ball 23 times for 78 yards.

Reilly has replaced senior Brad Rivers, who suffered a broken wrist against Plymouth Salem in the third game and is probably done for the season. Reilly was 7-of-18 for 89 yards. Junior tailback Kirk Moundros rushed for 69 yards on 15 carries.

"The thing I like is these kids care," O'Leary said. "They try hard. It's not that they don't give a damn. If the kids give you everything they've got, what more can you ask?"

## Cornwell paces Hawks

Junior Zack Cornwell found a multitude of ways to score points Saturday, accounting for 16 of them in Farmington Harrison's 22-3 victory over Northville.

Cornwell kicked a field goal, ran for one touchdown, caught a touchdown pass and booted an extra point.

The Hawks drove 80 yards with the opening kickoff and took a 7-0 lead with 6:42 remaining in the first quarter. Cornwell ran the final 6 yards and added the PAT.

Cornwell's 26-yard field goal at 3:14 in the second quarter gave Harrison a 10-0 halftime lead.

Senior quarterback Kevin Bameneke threw a pair of touchdown passes in the third quarter.

The first was a school-record 99-yarder to sophomore receiver Ricky Bryant. Bameneke's pass traveled nearly 50 yards in the air. Northville blocked the PAT.

With nine seconds left in the quarter, Cornwell caught a 29-

yard touchdown pass from Bameneke. The pass attempt for two points failed, and the Hawks led 22-0.

The Mustangs avoided a shutout with a 21-yard field goal with 1:16 remaining in the game.

Harrison passed for 252 of its 368 total yards. Bameneke was 10-of-18 for 244 and Jared Hopkins 1-of-2 for 8.

Bryant caught two passes for 118 yards and Mike Hood three for 52. Chris Ghannam rushed 10 times for 38 yards and Cornwell seven for 30. Harrison had a 12-10 edge in first downs.

Head had five tackles and seven assists plus an interception on defense. Ed Hight had three tackles and five assists, and Chris Burgess recovered a fumble.

The Hawks are 5-1 overall and 3-1 in the Western Division of the Western Lakes Activities Association.

Northville is 0-6 and 0-4.
