CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDINANCE SUMMARY C-633-96

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON, MICHIGAN, BY AMENDING CHAPTER 35, ZONING, TO REVISE REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO RECEPTION ANTENNA FACILITIES AND CELLULAR TOWER AND ANTENNA FACILITIES

Section 35-205 amends the requirement for site plan approval in single family raning districts of reception antenna facilities (cable diabes) to those having a diameter in excess of 3 feet pad maintains previous site plan requirements of the ordinance.

requirements of the ordinance. Section 35-206 provides for collular tower and antennae to be located in specific areas of the city. Collular towers may be located in M1, M2 and M3 soning districts. Towers shall not exceed 120 feet in height. Towers shall be located no closer than 1,000 feet to other towers and require screening of the base of the tower with evergireen trees unless waited eather strength of the base of the tower with evergireen trees unless waited eather the 1,000 feet to other towers and require screening of the base of the tower with evergireen trees unless waited eather the photos transmission may be located on the roofs of buildings in ERO, CBB, C2, C3, M1, M12 and M3 zoning districts whether or not they are accessory. The antennae shall not exceed the height of the support structure by more than 12 feet and the supporting structure shall not exceed the height of the district by more than 10 feet. Setback requirements from outer walls or roof areas are also required.


