Boy seriously injured after being hit by van

A young boy was hit by a van at Grand River and Middlebelt at about 3:45 p.m. Friday, Farmington Hills police said.

The youth, whose name was not available Friday night, was riding his bicycle east of Middlebelt at the time of the accident. While crossing the street, he was hit by a blue van traveling eastbound and driven by a man.

The boy experienced severe head trauma and was taken to

Botsford Hospital and pronounced in critical condition.

The boy, believed to be between the ages of 9-12, was then moved to William Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak.

"It was not a hit-and-run," said Farmington Hills Police Chief William Dwyer. "The driver was released, pending further investigation."
