\* Sterling silver Pueblo bowl (1893) –
Originally exhibited at the 1893 World's
Columbian Exposition in Chicago, this silver, silver gilt, copper and niello bowl's design is inspired by American

Indian pottery.
• American flag brooch (1876) - This is a large brooch of rubics, diamonds, sapphires, platinum and gold, fash-ioned into a waving flag with 13 stars and stripes representing the original

 Transatlantic cable (1858) –
 Charles Lewis Tiffany, the company's founder, sold souvenir pieces of the first transatlantic cable linking America to Europe telegraphically, Mounted on brass and authenticated with a document only Tiffany & Co. could provide, the souvenirs caused such excitement in New York that police were called to

ontrol the crowds.

• White House state china (1968) President and Mrs. Lyndon Johnson commissioned this design, which features botanical renderings of native American flowers. More than three years in the making, the service con-

sists of 250 place settings.

• Montana sapphire brooch (1900) A brooch of sapphires from Montana, freshwater pearls, diamonds, gold, plat-inum and enamel, this piece was part of Tiffany's prize-winning exhibit at the Paris Exposition Universelle in 1900. It gave Tiffany an opportunity to present American gemstones, mounted in mag-

American gemstones, mounted in mag-nificent large-scale jewelry.

Goelet yacht cup (1891) – This is a sterling silver and gold yacht cup, elab-orately decorated with swirling nauti-cal motifs, including mermaids, dol-phins and a serpentine rim. This partic-ular cup was awarded to The Gloriana, a sloop that won the first eight races it entered. It is one of more than 30 made for Orden Goelet, any of Tiffany & Co.'s for Ogden Goelet, one of Tiffany & Co.'s most prominent yacht prize customers.
