## Hogan reacts to campaigner's taped comments

The Michigan State Police commander who was recorded making sexist remarks about Ronna Romney will remain "an active part" of Matt Hogan's campaign for Oakland County sheriff.

"Those comments were inap-propriate," Hogan said Friday, "and they certainly do not reflect

and they certainly do not reflect my philosophy.

"But he made a mistake," Hogan said, "a mistake that embarrassed him and my campaign. I will not turn my back on him."

Hogan, a Democrat, is running against incumbent Republican John F. Nichols in Tuesday's election.

election.

As a decided underdog, Hogan said he felt as though he was gaining ground on the incumbent...until this week when Nichols supporters released comments from Lt. Ronald Lapp made on Oct. 23.

On that day Lapp, commander of the state police post in Ponti-

ac, called the sheriff's South Lyon substation to inquire about a crime, namely somebody being arrested for damaging political

arrested for damaging political signs.

The lieutenant, who is a cam-paign coordinator for Hogan, finished that conversation, but apparently did not properly hang up the telephone. The subse-quent conversation was record-

In that conversation, Lapp was In that conversation, Lapp was recorded making comments about Romney to an unidentified man. Lapp also talked about the case with which letters are ghost written and submitted to newspapers that run them as letters to the editor.

Nichols supporters were happy to make the content of the conversation — or transcripts of the

tape — available to the press.

Nichols himself, however, suggested contacting the press was payhack for something the Hogan camp did earlier in the eampaign — namely complain about Capt. Michael McCabe distributing Nichols literature while in uniform when the shertifies are measured in Exclusive. iff was appearing in Rochester

Hills.

If it had not been for that incident, Nichols told newspapers, I might have thrown the (Lapp) tapes in the waste basket.

As it is, Hogan is embarrased and Lapp faces possible disciplinary action.

A spokesperson for Romney insists Lapp should be fired from his state police post, far making vile, obscene remarks of a sexual nature about Mrs. Romney while

nature about Mrs. Romney while on state time.

"Lt. Lapp must be held accountable for his actions," spokesman Paul Welday said in a press release issued Thurady That's why I am calling for a full investigation by the internal affairs division of the state police and for the termination of this

"Our state troopers are among the finest in the nation and Lt. Lapp has sullied their reputa-tion and given them a big black eye," said Welday.

He also called for Romney's opponent, U.S. Sen. Carl Levia, and the Democratic Party to repudiate comments from Leo LaLonde, a paid campaiga advisor who seemed to rationalize Lapp's comments.

LaLonde, who is also chair of Macomb County Democrata, defended Lapp by insisting he was engaged in a private convergence.
