## Patterson sent back to executive's office

At Lilley's Restaurant in Auburn Hills, Oakland County Executive L. Brooks Patterson was happy as early results showed him jumping out to an early lead over Democratic challenger Edward Hamilton.

Yet Patterson's joy was tempered. "I think Mr. Dole is gonna finish second," he said as hundreds of supporters savored the evening... and a buffet featuring Oysters Rockefeller.

Not only was the executive right about Dole, Patterson called it well before Tom Brokaw of NBC and other television networks made similar announcements on the 9 ectock news.

Patterson took an early lead over Hamilton and never looked back. "This is a Republican area," he said, "and the results will bear that out."

Uncertified results compiled Wednesday showed Patterson pulling 60.4 percent of the vote compared with 39.6 for Hamilton. The incumbent pulled 290,356 votes, and the challenger got 190,572.

"The Clinton tornado didn't help me at all," Hamilton said early, "I was counting on Clinton's coattails, but they just weren't there for me."

Hamilton congratulated the victor. "But I'm still miffed he wouldn't debate . . . not even before the League of Women Vot-

ers," he said.

For Patterson, however, the evening — with one exception — went as expected. "I think voters recognize the good work we've done," he said.

That exception, of course, was in the prosecutor's race where Patterson supported and actively campaigned for fellow Republican David Gorcyca. The executive knew the prosecutor's race would be closer than his own, but he expected Gorcyca and other

Early in the campaign, Patterson took on a big assignment. Early polling showed President Clinton and Senator Carl Levin, at the top of the ticket, running strong. Those polls could always be wrong, but the executive — known as Mr. Republican of Southeast Michigan — had to face the possibility that once voters started voting Democratic, they wouldn't stop.

ance of being out of touch.

That was a bigger problem for Dole than any gender gap, said Moran, an airline attendant who started election day in Dallas. Patterson, 57, of Waterford previously said his second term would be a continuation of his first, with emphasis on strengthening the economic climate. He would, however, work toward a goal that has cluded him and his predecessor, namely getting back from Lansing a higher percentage of tax dollars Oakland residents pay into state coffers.

Hamilton, 53, of Troy was disappointed Wednesday, but not too demoralized to look to the future. I may well run for governor in two years," he said, "From the possible candidates I've seen so far, namely Doug Ross and Don Riegle, the Democratic Party needs a conservative.

"Without me in the race, the Democrats could drift too much," said Hamilton.
