POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Farmington Hills firefighters made 109 runs for the week of Oct. 28 to Nov. 3 including 66 medical emergencies (61 percent), 14 downed power lines and five fires.

FIRES

In Farmington Hills:
Firefighters from Station 1 responded to a fire in a 1991 Ford Explorer on Grand River at Halsted at 4:18 p.m. Nov. 1. The owner had put out an engine fire that had spread to an interior compartment with no known

reason for the break down.

Firefighters from Station 2 responded to a car fire on west-bound I-696 west of Orchard Lake at 3:06 a.m. Oct. 2. The car, a 1992 Eagle Talon, had been in an accident and the driver admitted to drinking. The driver had put out the fire with a dry chemical extinguisher. Damage to the car was estimated at \$7,500.

THEFT

In Farmington Hills:
