roadway.

"It's an important corridor,"

Frank Lauhoff said.

Engineering costs are expected to run \$350,000 with the federal government paying 80, percent. Farmington and Faymington Hills pick up \$117,000 each while the road commission pays \$35,000.

The road will be replaced and likely widened six feet on each side — most of which is right of way property.

Farmington City Council

passed an ordinance prohibit-ing right-of-way parking by

residents on Farmington Road.

"We're a three-car family," said Farmington Road resident Joseph Moskal. "It's going to be a problem not having anywhere to park. We're going to be bouncing cars in and out. "It's going to be tough." Parking needs by Farmington Road residents are being considered, Lauhoff said.

"For those people on the Farmington side we're going to work with the county to provide concrete turnaround pads as part of the construction," Lauhoff said.
