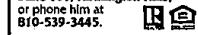


**THE 'GOODS' ON REAL ESTATE**

**DON'T WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE**

In most real estate transactions there are a few responsibilities that the sellers have to handle before the closing, such as repairs and termite extermination. The deadline for completing these obligations usually coincides with the actual closing. Many sellers barely make that deadline. Those who wait until the last minute to handle these matters may miss the deadline altogether or pay high rates in order to get a plumber, roofer or electrician on an emergency basis.

Your buyers will probably get a structural inspection done after the contract is ratified. Within 10 days of the contract's acceptance by all parties, the pest inspection should be scheduled. Even though sellers usually know well in advance what is needed, they sometimes put things off until the buyers have finalized the loan approval process. Since these repairs will have to be made anyway, it is a good idea to get them done promptly.

"We have four different designs. One was designed by a former hospice patient, one is by a sibling of a pediatric patient, and the other two are designed by children of hospice employees," Ripple said.

The holiday card sales represent a small portion of the budget, but it provides for a good community outreach program.

"For the families, it's a good way to give back to Angela Hospice. It's also our way to give to the community by having holiday cards available," Ripple added.

Sixty non profit organizations throughout the metro area will sell their cards this year.

The Juvenile Diabetes Foun-

dation has an office at 29350 Southfield Road, suite 42, in Southfield. Holiday card sales over the past sixteen years have raised between \$20,000 and \$25,000 per year.

Besides using the sale as a fundraiser, the sale allows outstate members to give to the foundation.

"I think it (the reason we sell cards) was basically a fundraising opportunity and I think another part of it was to reach chapter members who may not otherwise be able to participate in some of the fundraising. We have members throughout the state," said Marcia Moglia, holiday card sales co-chairwoman.

The organization offers nine

different styles that vary in price from \$15.50 to \$27.50. For more information, call the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation International at 569-6171.

Money aside, the holiday card sale is a special event for the Michigan Humane Society. The cards, offered in six different styles, cost \$10 for 20 cards and envelopes at the Rochester Hills, Detroit and Westland humane society locations.

Or they can be ordered by phone at 650-1179. The society also sells pet stockings, snow/mow cat stickers that measure snowfall and grass, and stocking stuffer ornaments.

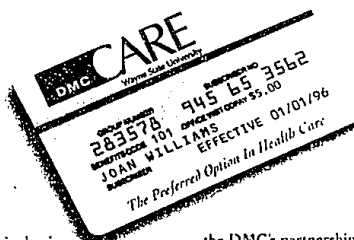
