Observer carrier soars to top, just won't quit

Jeremy Marek builds model airplanes, but he's learning to fly by other means on his Farmington Observer paper routes.

That's right, paper routes.

The Power Middle School seventh grader has five routes totaling 132 customers, which keeps him hopping Monday and Thursday afternoons. He wants more subscribers, too.

When he's not delivering papers or building model airplanes, Marek, 13, spends his spare time signing up new subscribers. Since March, Farmington Observer Circulation Manager Mike Cummins estimates Marek has brought in 100 new subscribers. He started off with 25 customers on his route.

Marek's sales pitch is simple.
"I just go up and say, 'Would you like to sign up for the Farmington Observer," he said. 'I just tell them I don't have that muny customers and they'll feel sorry for me.
"I get five to 10 new starts a week."
Marek has been a carrier for only half a year. months. A friend's mother will drive him on his route. Otherwise, Marek delivers papers riding his bike to subdivisions, office complexes and apartment buildings alike. Apartments on his routes include: Farmington Oak, Kensington Manor and Sunview Manor.

Marck usually receives 50 extra papers so he can leave samples with customers, a Farmington Observer assistant area circulation manager said.

"He's such a go-getter," the O&E's Libby Heppler said. "... he's first to call in a new start or a stop. "He just does not give up."

Marck plans to run track or cross country. He enjoys sprinting to his friend's house, he said. In the future, he'd like to go to college and become a doctor.

In the meantime, he's content to fly by foot on his Observer routes.
