Warriors battle Rams | Pro-am offers gift-giving idea for bowlers in Class AA semifinal

Speedy senior tailback Scott Naz (6-0, 170) also has a pair of touchdowns in the posteason.

Rockford, under coach Ralph Munger, also uses the wing-T and has scored 75 points in two playoff victories. The Rams crushed Muskegon, 41-6, in the opener and edged Bay City Central in overtime last week, 34-28.

"Ralph has been running the Wing-T for a long time, so we both know each others offense, said Apap, "They have a good quarterback, run a 52 defense, and are very tough physically."


