A love of painting comes through in the works by Elaine Treisman on display through Nov. 27 at Galerie Blu, 568 N. Woodward in Birmingham The oil paintings glow with jewel like colors. Figures and shapes are outlined in black, giving an air of youthful innocence. At the same time, an adult humor is felt.
