

POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS

Farmington Hills firefighters made 97 runs for the week of Nov. 25 through Dec. 1 including 55 (57 percent) medical emergencies and four fire calls. The department made 464 runs for the month of November including 256 medical emergencies (55 percent), 44 rescues (9 percent) and 16 fires.

In Farmington Hills:

Firefighters from Station 3 responded to a report of a carbon monoxide leak at a house on Fink at 10:35 a.m. Nov. 28 and found high levels and notified Consumers Power and asked the resident to turn off his furnace until the problem could be repaired.

Firefighters from Station 4 put out a small shelf fire in the back of a garage on Briarton at 4:26 p.m. Nov. 27. A burning cigarette may have started the fire that caused \$5,000 in damage.

In Farmington Hills:

An aluminum tire and wheel worth \$250 were stolen from a green 1993 Pontiac Bonneville parked at the Streamwood Condominiums on Middlebelt Nov. 28-29.

A \$350 Snowchief snow blower was stolen from American House on Middlebelt Nov. 29-30.

ROBBERY

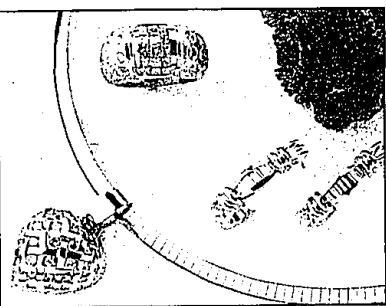
In Farmington Hills:
