This past season of girls swimming was memorable as the changing of the guard took place.
Observerland said good bye to possibly the best female high school awimmer to ever compete at an area school — Livonia Stevenson's Anne Aristeo.
But as Aristeo, and several other leading mainstays depart, such as Farmington Harrison's Lisa Richardson and Plymouth Salem's Youne Lynn, a host of rew and talented swimmers strived on the seene.
Unfortunately for Western Lakes Activities Association schools, most of those new faces were competing for Stevenson.
The Spartans once again displayed their dominance by winding the WLAA title and going on to win three events at the Class A championships en route to a third-place finish.
Aristeo completed her incredible high school career by breaking the state record in the 500 yard freestyle with a time of 448.67. She will swim next year for Stanford University and quite possibly for the U.S. in the next Olympies.
