As for regular blood donations, for some reason they always are low in December, supporters said.

"My experience is that people are so busy at this time of year they're just not able to find that little bit of time to donate." Main said. "People don't want to do something to make them tired."

Jeff Weathers, director of products and hospital service for the Southeastern Michigan Chapter of the Red Croes, said it needs 1,000 pints of blood a day at this time of year and gets only about 500-600.
