Take yourself back to 1967, when the first Camaro was born. Wide hood stripes were all the rage. Thirty yoars later, Chevrolet brings back the wide stripes on the anniversary edition Camaro.

There will only be 1,000 of these "Hugger" orange-striped arctic white Camaros built, so it's certain they'll become collector cars. The anniversary edition is stocked full of special features.

It's a doggone pretty package,

Complimenting the interior are white front leather bucket seats with black-and-white cloth inserts. At the top of the headrest is a neat 30th anniversary heat-stamped logo. The seats are new and are wider to offer better lumbar support during long-distance driving.

It's the beautiful 5.7-liter LT4
V8 engine with sequential fuel injection that's graced the Corvette for a number of years. Turn the key and this engine roars to life, has a beautiful, throaty growl on takeoff and makes this puppy just too much fun to drive.

The 5.7-liter features a castiron block and east-aluminum cylinder head and provides 350 horses under the hood.

Mated to a 6-speed manual transmission, the V8 performs flawlessly and gives you power with just a tap on the accelerator. Without trying to risk an accident, if you look at the tachometer, it barely moves when you shift into the different gears. ent gears.

The 6-speed performed quite well, but there was one annoyance. On occasion, when shooting out of the gate, there was a second-shift override. When you tried to get it into third, it was

One thing was new to me. In choosing the pre-calculated equalizer choices there now is one just for country-western. Usually you can just pick the rock choice on most. But there actually was a difference in sound when you chose the "C-W" mode. The sterre also has a The Leek security system on TheftLock security system on

Other neat features on the anniversary edition include remote keyless entry, leatherwrapped steering wheel, power windows with driver's express down, theft-deterrent alarm system, remote rear hatch release, power door locks, twin remote leactric mirrors, electric rear window defogger, electronic speed control, fob lamps, 6-way power driver's seat, 16-inch aluminum wheels on 16-inch performance blackwalls and acceleration slip regulation (designed to decrease tire spin on slippery surfaces).

Safety doesn't take a back seat on this Camaro. No surprise that it has dual air begs or even daytime running lamps. But standard is a 4-wheel antilock brake system. There also reinforced steel safety carge with steel side-door beams and front and rear crush zones. The safety belts were easy enough to get into and out of in the front seats, but the in the rear seats were a bit annoying.

All Chamaro owners have, at their dispatch, the Chevrolet 24-hour Roadside Assistance program. The program provides everything from a gallon of gas and free towing for warranty repairs to free locksmith and routing assistance. Heek, you can even have a tire changed or Other neat features on the

a jump start if need be.
Camaro also features platinum-tipped spark pluge that don't need maintenance for the first 100,000 miles, automatic trans fluid that never needs replacing, battery-rundown protection and extended-life engine scalent, and for 5 years are coolant good for 5 years or 150,000 miles (whichever comes

150,000 miles (whichever comes first).

The anniversary edition wasn't outrageous in cost, either. It starts at a reasonable \$20,115 and with all the bells and whish

and with all the bells and whistles topped out at \$24,217. Not
bad for a collector's item.
This pony sure is a lot of fun
to drive, looks great and performs well. You'd expect the
younger kids to be craning their
necks to get a look at this
anniversary edition Camaro.
