The centest provides national recognition for editorial achievement.



# Go west to recycle paper, plastic, more

Farmington area residents will heed Horatic Alger's advice when recycling: Head west.

Residents will be instructed to use the Resource Recovery Recycling Authority of Southwest Oakiand County's drop-off site at the City of Novi, Dewal Drive, north of 11 Mile and west of Meadowbrook.

The new regional site — that opened Dec. 2 — will sarve Farmington Hills as well as Novi, Wixom and South Lyon. As a result, Farmington intends to close its drop-off site Jan. 1.

Farmington Hills residents have been using the Farmington site since the Hills drop-off spot a was closed due to remodeling of the city's Department of Public Works area.

"We think it's a good opportunity for Farmington and Farmington Hills residents as well as those communities on the out-skirts," RRRASOC Director Michael Caspo said. "They were using it surreptitiously, Now they can use it on the up and up. "We think we'll get a lot of Farmington and Farmington Hills residents because, quite frankly, it's easier to get to."

More items can be recycled at the new facility. Cardboard, paperboard, white office paper,

household batteries, acrosol cans and scrap metal are among those materials that can be dropped off at the Novi site.

Only newspaper, plastics, glass, tin cans and oil were accepted at the Farmington drop-off spot.
Residents will be given maps to the new site and notified on cable Channel 15 and through the city's newsletter, City Manager Frank Lauhoff said.

"In some ways, it's probably going to be less convenient for some people," Lauhoff said. "If you live on the west side, it's probably not going to matter as much. It depends on where you live really."

The trade-off is the new site accepts more materials, which allows eities to receive more money from the contractor through the sale of recyclobles, Lauhoff said. Also, the Novi site will be open Monday through Saturday, making it more accessible for residents.

RRRASOC is also considering a permanent hazardous waste drop-off site, which would be open regularly.

Farmington and Farmington Hills residents currently dispose these items — such as oil-based paints, chemicals, paint thinners, and pesticides — during a one-day Household Hazardous Waste Day.
