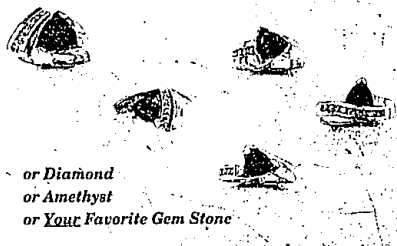

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS

Farmington Hills firefighters made 138 runs for the week of Dec. 1-8 including 84 medical emergencies (61 percent), 12 rescues and four fires. It was the busiest single week of activity for the department for 1996.

THEFT

In Farmington Hills:

A \$300 NEC cellular phone was stolen from a white 1995 GMC Yukon parked at Office Max on 14 Mile Dec. 4.

A \$65,000 yellow Case back hoe and a \$30,000 Case unloader were stolen from U.S. Post Office property at Indoplex and Drake Dec. 7-9.
