Why don't you try these decor tips

Why don't you hunt for a wroughtiron, six-foot-tall, tripod plate stand? They are wonderful used in various ways.

They are meant for plates, of course. But they are stunning when accommodating many other items. You

should be able to buy the stand for less than \$200. Set it in a corner and it becomes truly decorative.

I have ensconced knock-out bowls in graduated sizes, largest at the bottom, filled with shiny holly greens and berries. What a show!

I have stacked varied edible fruits on plates – all shiny red apples on one plate, all pears on a second, all tangerines on a third, all bananas, all grapes, all nuts. Add a small stack of fruit plates and knives for convenience. Wonderful colors. You have created a center that people will gravitate to, and enjoy! A cocktail party conversation piece.

You can display collections of your own choosing. Set them out on 3/4-inch-thick rounds of glass. Your friends will love it. Sculpture, modern or period, would be unparalleled.

Why don't you buy plastic drawer stoe boxes, and stack them? They can be three or four feet high, or graduated as if steps. What you fill them with will make them successful. One colorful thought is the collection you have of match covers and boxes from restaurants and hotels wherever you have traveled.

Another content could be goldfish. Fill each drawer with water, a little sand, tiny marbles of beautiful colors and small fish. One drawer might contain only floating greens. Clearly a lot of fun

Why don't you execute an esthetic skirted table? The round table can be very inexpensive, merely the right height and diameter for your needs.

The plain, but nonetheless fine quality of the fabric for the large round underskirt needs to be coordinated with the colors of the patterned square top. This should be the most handsome material you can find. Enhance same with gorgeous elongated tassels at the four corners. These will also function to hold the top in place with elan. What a way to go!

Why don't you reassess your collection of books, and how you would like them to resonate a library? Do you have any sets that are beautifully bound (but hardly ever read)? They do make an impression, even on yourself. Yes, give them top billing, and organize current publications nearby.

If you have good shelf space take advantage of it. If not, create shelves supported by angle brackets, even in narrow spaces. You can buy shelving that is prefinished, or buy thick pine boards cut to your size and painted. The shelves should be 10 inches deep.

Bookends are helpful but not always necessary. Lay several books down at one end of a stack and place an interesting "objet d"art" on top. It will break up the all-book look.

An extra large dictionary will be much used and a welcome addition. There are several stunning brass dictionary stands so that you can leave the book open.
