

POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FIRE

In Farmington Hills:

Firefighters from Station 2 put out a fire that was in the engine compartment and dashboard of a 1989 Ford Escort in the lot of the Kroger store on Middlebelt at 8:20 a.m. Jan. 16. The owner said she had been advised that the piston rings were worn and the motor needed replacement. Co-workers tried to put out the fire with dry chemical extinguishers before firefighters arrived, but could not. Damage to the car was total (\$2,000) and damage to contents was \$200.

Firefighters from Station 3 put out a fire in a crawl space of a house on Albion at 12:18 a.m. Jan. 17. The owner said he had tried to thaw a frozen water pipe. The fire caused \$100 in damage.

Firefighters from Station 1 put out charring embers from a fire at the Carvers restaurant on Sinacole at 8:18 p.m. Jan. 17. The manager said a plumber had been making repairs to pipes in the mechanical room earlier in the day. A hand torch had apparently caused the insulation to catch fire, causing a small fire in the wall. Employees had used dry chemical extinguishers to put out the fire. Firefighters cut away part of an exterior wall to put out the embers. Damage is estimated at \$1,000.

Firefighters from Station 3 responded to a reported stove fire at a house on Haynes at 1:36 p.m. Jan. 19. The homeowner had left a pot of cooking oil unattended on the stove. It had ignited and the man put the lid back on, extinguishing the fire with no damage.

In Farmington:
Firefighters evacuated Wash Hut after smoke was detected

from a burning lint filter in a dryer at the Grand River Avenue laundromat Jan. 19.

FIRE DEPARTMENT RUNS

Farmington Hills firefighters made 125 runs for the week of Jan. 13-19 including 56 medical runs (45 percent), 18 personal injury accidents and five fires.

THEFT

In Farmington Hills:
