

Andover senior backs up top rating

Dinna Ospina showed why she is one of the country's top junior players over the weekend at the Winter Junior Championships hosted by the Franklin Racquet Club in Southfield.

Ospina, a 17-year-old senior at Bloomfield Hills Andover High School, lived up to her billing as the top-seeded player in Girls 18 singles with a three-set victory over Janet Bergman from Hilton Head, S.C., 3-6, 6-4, 6-1.

Bergman, seeded fourth, was the only player to win a set off Ospina in the four-day tournament. Ospina dropped just a dozen games in her four previous matches, including a 6-1, 6-3 semifinal victory over No. 3-seeded Selia Mathew from Tulsa, Okla.

Ospina currently is ranked among the top 15 players nationally in Girls 18-under division. Last year, Ospina, who works out of The Sports Club of West Bloomfield with coaches Ed Nagle and Phil Norville, placed

third at the Girls 18 Western Indoor Closed Tournament and the National Indoor Girls 18-tournament. She also participated in the 1996 Junior U.S. Open.

Ospina also is a strong doubles player.

In the Girls 16-under competition, Andover freshman Hillary Adams placed second. Adams, the 14-year-old top seed, fell in the championship match to Ohio native Michelle Dacosta in a tough three-set match, 6-4, 4-6, 7-5 (6-2 tie-breaker).

Adams, the current Class B state champion from Bloomfield Hills Andover High School, won four matches en route to the finals.

"These tournaments are much more competitive and have a lot more pressure than high school tournaments," said Adams, who has aspirations of one day

becoming a pro.

Other singles winners included Jennifer Magley (Lawrence, Kan.) in Girls 14, James Black (Fairfield, Conn.) in Boys 18, Wade Orr (Clarksville, Tenn.) in Boys 16 and D.J. Gaetz (Minneapolis) in Boys 14.

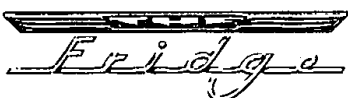
"It was a good match but it came down to who was going to control the ball, have the set-ups and the hits for the winning points in each game," Farmington coach Julie Ingalls said.
